I would like to thank all the staff involved in organizing this conference from The University of Tokyo, The National University of Singapore (NUS) and the ASLI secretariat.

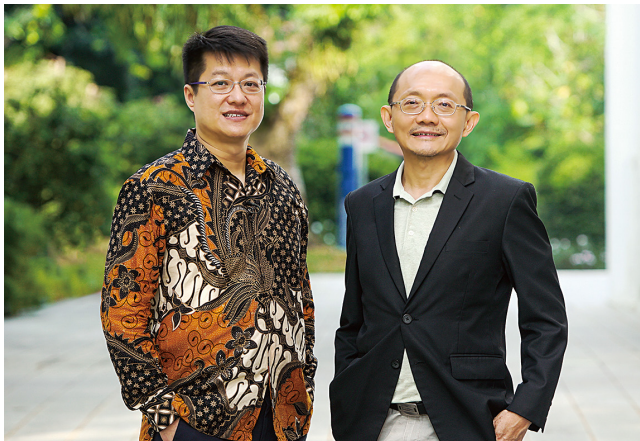

Key Note Speaker



Justice Katsuya UGA

Justice Katsuya Uga graduated from the University of Tokyo, Faculty of Law in 1978. After graduation, he was immediately appointed as an assistant professor of the same Faculty and started his career as an academic. He was promoted to associate professor in 1981, and to full professor in 1994.

Justice Uga has also visited top US law schools, including Harvard Law School (as visiting researcher in 1983 and as visiting professor in 1990), University of California, Berkeley (as visiting researcher in 1984), and Georgetown Law School (as visiting scholar in 1998).

In March 2019, he was appointed as a justice of the Japanese Supreme Court by the Government of Japan.
