About

Disruptive Technologies (DTs), show nowadays the possibility to increase dramatically the efficiency of the business processes typically operated by **Public Administrations** (PAs) and public service providers. These technologies allow the enhancement of data and information used for decision making, as well as the automation of processes. At the same time, DTs are often interaction-based solutions developed by making extensive use of Learning Functions, and this makes them particularly prone to ethics-related issues. The DTs have the potential to **transform the public sector**, providing numerous benefits to society.

ETAPAS aims to co-design and co-create with PAs a framework consisting of ethical principles, a set of measurable indicators and a legal construct for the responsible adoption of DTs. This framework is tested and validated on four use cases, developed in ETAPAS use cases.

This workshop organised by the **ETAPAS project** wants to bring together **policy makers from European public administrations** to share how ETAPAS framework is used in MEF use case, what is already accomplished and what still need to be done.

The main topics of discussion will be:

- **ETAPAS** framework exemplified with one use case, what is already accomplished and what still need to be done.
- Experience and need of DTs in **Public Administrations**
- **AI Carriers and Facilitators** to public services
